**Sacred Music:** I would like to thank our musicians (cantors and pianists) who have done a wonderful job the past year. Their job is far from easy, especially given that we have no music director or hymnals. Bradley Hardee (pianist) schedules people on a weekly basis. Laura Boronski (head cantor) has been ever faithful with creating our worship aids for months now, which is a very time-consuming task, as it requires choosing music from a very limited source (One License), submitting the music choice to One License each week to keep us legally protected for copyright purposes, & inserting the readings, artwork, and other pertinent information. Laura White (another pianist) brings great academic knowledge of sacred music and many years of experience in various parishes settings. I sat down with these three on Father’s Day to discuss ways in which our sacred music ministry can be a greater gateway to encountering the Body of Christ at our “singing” Masses. A couple resolutions were made. (1) We will be purchasing enough St. Michael Hymnals (5<sup>th</sup> edition) or a digital license from its publisher for copyright purposes to expand our repertoire and to bring greater stability, as the downloadable translations and keys for music on One License and the public domain have been “all over the board”. (2) We will continue to make and use worship aids, given our “growing problem” as a community (which is a great problem to have!), our limited storage capabilities, and their helpfulness to visitors and new members of our community. However, we’re enlisting more help with their creation so that we will have them completed more than a couple days in advance which will help our less frequent cantors and pianists prepare more. (3) Music will be chosen quarterly and with greater intentionality by the music team. It will incorporate some songs you are likely familiar with, but it will also seek to teach hymns you may not have heard in years or ever heard at all to expose you and the community to the rich patrimony of the Church. (4) It’s my hope to have a children’s and an adults’ choir this fall when we solidify a practice space, larger worship space, and director.
