The music ministry at CCCF has been busy preparing for worship! We had a fruitful meeting with Fr. David and have since met and planned the hymns for the next several months. Our goal is to provide a rich variety of hymns that will inspire, encourage, and deepen our worship experience. With the purchase of the 'St. Michael' hymnal, our resources for music selection have expanded to include hymns from the Catholic tradition as well as contemporary compositions.

In addition to music that is well-known, it is our plan to introduce our congregation to 'new' hymns on a regular basis. Since there is a wealth of music that is available, and since the majority of hymns in hymnals goes unsung, we feel it would be a great time to learn something new. We are fortunate to have 'musical' priests – Fr. David and those visiting priests that have joined us this past year have all given voice to the Mass – and encouraged us to participate. Congregational singing is another way to express our faith and draw us closer to our Creator. It has been said that people like what they know – but do not necessarily know what they could like. With that in mind, we would like to take this opportunity to introduce you to a 'new' song.

"O Worship the King" will be sung frequently in the next several months – it is originally from England, composed in 1708 by William Croft. It is found in many hymnals, and you may have heard it before using different texts. Every hymn has a common name and a tune name. Our new hymn has the tune name "Hanover". The tune name may come from a variety of sources, it could be the birthplace of the composer, a county in Ireland, or from a Latin background, for example "Adeste Fidelis" is the tune name for "O Come All Ye Faithful". In the case of our new hymn, the words are worshipful – appropriate and the music is inspiring. To more familiarize yourself with the music, you can listen to it on several YouTube channels featuring choir, congregation, and keyboard accompaniment.

We are so encouraged every weekend to hear the congregation singing with us at Mass! Thank you for your encouragement, kind words and support of our ministry. May our hearts be uplifted to God – the source of all good gifts!
