GOOD NEWS TO SHARE



Child saved through Daniel's Law: On January 25th, the first baby of 2022 was surrendered at the Lexington Medical Center under the SC Safe Haven Act or Daniel's Law. The baby girl was born healthy at 8 lbs. 7oz. on January 21st, and the mother left the baby at the hospital upon discharge.

Under the Safe Haven for Abandoned Babies Act, the Lexington County Department of Social Services took custody of the child, who has been placed in foster care. Daniel's Law is meant to prevent dangerous and often fatal abortions. Enacted in 2000, it provides parents in South Carolina with a safe option to surrender newborns to social services and foster care. Under the law, parents or guardians have up to 60 days to surrender a baby at designated legal locations, including: hospitals, police stations, houses of worship and fire departments.

The diocese encourages each of our parishes to attend training for Safe Haven for Abandoned Babies Act the so that we can be a welcome, secure place for parents to surrender children without judgement and to safeguard the lives of newborns.

Rev. Jeb S. Donelan, Pastor of the Diocesan Mission Parish

Born in a small town of Virginia an hour outside of Washington, D.C. called Warrenton, Fr. Donelan grew up with his father, mother, two sisters and one brother. He is the oldest of his siblings and graduated in 2005 from the University of Virginia with a Bachelor of Art in History. In August of 2005 Fr. Donelan began his seminary studies in Philosophy at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in Philadelphia, PA and continued his studies in Theology at the Pontifical University Gregorianum in Rome, Italy earning a Bachelor's in Sacred Theology and a Masters in Dogmatic Theology. Fr. Donelan was ordained in the Cathedral of St. Thomas More on June 11, 2011 for the Diocese of Arlington, Virginia.

Since his ordination he has served as Parochial Vicar at All Saints Parrish in Manassas, VA (2011-2014); Parochial Vicar of St. Anthony of Padua Parish in Falls Church, VA (2014-2019); Parochial Vicar of Good Shepherd Parish in Alexandria, VA (2019-2021), and now is Pastor of the Diocesan Mission Parish: St Francis of Assisi Parish in Banica, Dominican Republic (July 2021- Present). As well Fr. Donelan has served as Legion of Mary Spiritual Director of Hispanic Curia of Fairfax (2016-2020) and Diocesan Spiritual Director of Hispanic Cursillo of Diocese of Arlington (2017-2021). Fr. Donelan is happy and grateful that Jesus, the Good Shepherd has called him to the holy Priesthood and looks forward to many more years of sharing and preaching the Gospel to all God brings into his ministry.
