Fasting and abstinence during Lent

- Everyone age 14 year or older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.
- Everyone age 18 or older, and under age 59, is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- On Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one’s needs, but together should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

The Crux Bible Study – Beginning in Lent, we will start a community wide Bible Study of The Crux. The Crux is a Bible study that leads a group through the *kerygma*, the basic proclamation of the Gospel, and culminates in an invitation to accept the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It is only 5 weeks long since it will run throughout Lent. Instead of giving up chocolate this year, come and be part of this bible Study. Please email your interest to CCatCF@gmail.com. 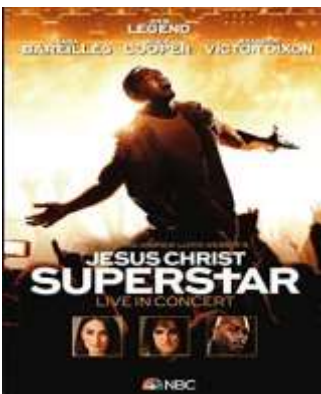

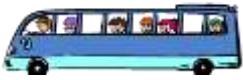
