## Kevin Becker and Pier Giorgio Frassati: Come Hear His Story – a Modern Day Miracle

In 2011, Kevin Becker fell off the roof of his college home and sustained life-threatening brain injuries that should have killed him. His chances of survival were slim, and if he did survive, he

would most likely remain in a vegetative state. During this ordeal, his friends and family knew of Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassati, O.P., an incredible, athletic, young man and member of the Dominican Third Order who died in 1925 at the age of 24. Since he needed a 2<sup>nd</sup> miracle in order to be canonized a saint, they turned to him and begged for his intercession, and a true miracle occurred which is now being examined by the Vatican! Kevin's story and miracle could help us call him Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati!


