

There is no "left turn out" at the southern entrance to the Seton School property. Horry County installed a sign as vehicles have been spotted turning out from the entrance lane. Please abide by the law. If you need to make a "left turn out" of Seton, the only place to do so is via the newer northern driveway at Silvercrest Drive.

Please **DO NOT DRIVE** across the lawn at Seton. This causes damage to the sprinkler system and additional expenses that CCCF is responsible to pay. Our Community has paid in excess of \$4,000 in repairs. Please only drive on the paved or dirt driveway when on Seton property and if there are no regular parking spaces available, only pull onto the first 10 feet of the lawn. This will minimize future damage to the Seton sprinkler system and additional expenses for our community.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Catholic School (SEASCC) and the Catholic Community at Carolina Forest (CCCF) are separate diocesan entities. CCCF pays rent to utilize the SEASCC building for Masses and various meetings after normal school hours/functions. CCCF parishioners and volunteers should not be on SEASCC property during normal school hours/functions without prior permission from school personnel. We appreciate CCCF parishioners and volunteers abiding with this requirement. Any donations to CCCF should be made payable to the Catholic Community at Carolina Forest.

Marco Beltramo tells the story: How often Frau Anna Danieli, who was accompanying us, recounted then at home in her dialect (half German, half Piedmontese, half Italian): "Giorgio has always been very kind, when we were out for a walk and met some poor people, his conversation was always that of helping the poor." One of the things that struck our housekeeper the most and that she went on to repeat left and right with her peculiar enthusiasm, was the time that we went to find the grandmother Frassati and she gave us two coins for one. I then began to fantasize about the thousand very small but very good things that I could buy with that money, but all of a sudden, Pier Giorgio stopped the path of my burning fantasy

saying: "Let's not buy anything, let's give them to the poor." And when we found a man that was asking for alms, we gave them to him. While I admired his generosity, it made me a little angry that he acted that way. Maybe it seemed foolish, perhaps superfluous: the truth is that at home they had gotten used to not refusing alms and therefore I submitted to what I considered his obsession, automatically imitating that which, instead, in him was enthusiasm and direct understanding of the suffering of others. NOCTURNAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION - December 2nd after the 5:30 pm Mass

- Our patron Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati (†1925) had a good habit of promoting and participating in nocturnal (all-night) Eucharistic Adoration at Santa Maria di Piazza Church in his hometown of Turin, Italy. There, he would just sit and pray for hours on end in front of the Blessed Sacrament for his family, friends, and the poor and sick. One time while promoting this devotion, some fascists at his university gave him quite the beating as he attempted to stop them from tearing down the announcement from the bulletin board. He lost that battle, but he is still winning the war! It goes without saying that to live in the footsteps of our patron, we should be people that approach Jesus in the Eucharist with great fervor and when we do not have it, we should ask Jesus for an increase.
- To carry on with our good adventure and become more of the parish that encompasses the spirit of Frassati, we are beginning our first nocturnal (all-night) Eucharistic Adoration beginning on Friday December 2nd (following the 5:30pm Mass) and ending on Saturday December 3rd (before the 9am Mass), here at Seton School. This will be a great way to enter the Advent season and pray for Jesus to come more deeply at Christmas into our homes, relationships, and lives. Some members of the Knights of Columbus have already signed-up to be present in prayer at all hours of our first nocturnal (all-night) Eucharistic Adoration.
