Teresa Vigna recalls: Together we used to visit the lepers in the Hospital of San Lazzaro in Turin. One day we found a young boy around 20 years old with his face marred by leprosy. Pier Giorgio remained impressed by the sight of this young boy with an exuberant body already totally defeated by sickness. "You see," he said, "what an enormous gift it is to be in good health as we are." And a moment later he added. "Also, the deformation of this young boy will disappear when in a few years he will reach Heaven. Therefore, we have the duty of putting our health at the service of those who do not possess it. To act otherwise would be to betray this great gift of God and His benevolence."

Save the date for our Parish Lenten Mission on March 20th - 22nd @ 6:15pm.

Who of us will ever forget the "Great Eucharistic Fast" during the COVID pandemic when we were obliged to close the doors of our churches denying our parishioners the opportunity to visit, pray and receive Christ's Body and Blood in the Eucharist? We found that the old adage, "absence makes the heart grow

fonder" is absolutely true. What pure joy we felt when finally, we were reunited with our loved ones in person! The first time we held our grandchildren in our arms, the first time we visited a dear elderly neighbor. Millions of Catholics around the world felt that same joy when finally, we returned to Mass in person celebrating one of the greatest blessings of our Faith, the deeply held conviction that Our Lord is truly present to us in the Eucharist.

On June 19, 2022, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops launched the 2021 – 2024 strategic plan that centers on the theme 'Created Anew by the Body and Blood of Christ, Source of Healing and Hope'. In conjunction with our own diocesan efforts, our parish has invited Father Joe Mele, a recently retired priest from the Diocese of Pittsburgh to deliver a preached Parish Lenten Mission on March 20-22 at 6:15 pm at Seton. Father Mele served in parish ministry for 35 years before working in seminary and lay leadership formation. He also taught Homiletics to seminarians and permanent deacon candidates in several dioceses. He combines scriptural and sound theological principles with humor and practical down-to-earth application to help his congregations deepen their love for Christ and with the Body of Christ, the Church, work together to restore human flourishing, unity and salvation on earth.

Father Joe will preach at all Masses on the weekend of March 18-19 so you can meet him. He's a wonderful friend and priest, one who truly loves Our Lord and loves nothing better than sharing that love, his joy in Christ especially as we prepare for the great feast of Easter. We hope you will join Father for as much of our Parish Lenten Mission as your schedule permits.



Fasting and Abstinence during Lent - Catholics age 14 and older do not eat meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent, including Good Friday. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics age 18 to 59 also fast. Only one full meal, and two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal, are eaten. Exemption is allowed for pregnant women and those who need

regular meals for medical reasons.
