Frassati Catholic School Subsidy Guidelines - The following guidelines were established by Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati Catholic Church regarding an individual's active participation in Parish life.

How we define active participation at Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati Catholic Church:

1. Officially registered in the parish of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati Catholic Church.
2. Faithful attendance to Mass on Sundays and Holy Days at our parish unless traveling; *if, for your livelihood, you must work on Saturday evening and Sunday and cannot attend one of our 4 Masses, then Father David can discuss granting you a dispensation to attend a weekday Mass instead.*
3. Financially contributing to the parish – the biblical principle is to tithe (give at least 10%) of your income to charities (usually half to your parish and the other half to your choosing). If this is difficult or impossible because of significant debt beyond a mortgage, then start by counting your Catholic school tuition towards the 10%. Giving by check, envelope, or online \$10 weekly (less than what a fast-food meal costs today) is a good place to start, if you have not.
4. Participation in a ministry (liturgical, social, etc.), helping with various parish events, or providing some other service makes our elderly smile and our community more vibrant.

Why do we tithe?

All that we have, and all that we are, comes from God. Giving is a way of thanking God for his kindness by returning to him a portion of the time, talent, and treasure he has given us. The children of God have a rich history of tithing and are paid back in kind as “God loves the cheerful giver” (2 Cor 9:7). Tithing—giving ten percent of our substance—is inspiring and attractive. Moreover, it simplifies our life of faith! Rather than additional weekly collections that complicate personal finances and extend liturgies, the Tithing Committee recommends that we tithe on our gross weekend offertory as a parish. The parish started this practice when we officially became a parish.

Why do we have a Tithing Committee?

As a parish in the Diocese of Charleston, we are required annually to participate in about 20 “second collections” for various Catholic causes and ministries (locally and internationally). We, as a parish, can decide for the remaining weeks of each year what organizations we want to support financially with our tithe. Beyond our own Friends of Frassati outreach, there are many *other* worthy Catholic and non-Catholic ministries or causes to help financially to fulfill the Gospel mandate of charity. The Tithe Committee consists of five members who will assist the pastor in reviewing requests and suggestions from parishioners and determining the annual schedule of tithes.

Will the parish notify us of who receives the weekly tithe?

Recipient organizations and tithe amounts will be listed in the following week’s bulletin so parishioners can see where their support is going throughout the year. The next week’s tithe recipient will also be listed along with a brief description of the organization and its website if information about the charity is sought or if additional donations would like to be made directly by you.

The Tithe Committee has decided that 5% of our 10% weekly tithe will go to Friends of Frassati, and the remaining 5% will go to one of the Diocesan-mandated or Parish-chosen causes. *Note: Friends of Frassati is our parish’s charity and service “arm” established to imitate our patron Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati.*

How can I suggest a charity to receive our tithe?

A form will be available on the parish website for parish members to make recommendations. All charities must be nonpolitical and align with the Catholic Church's morals.

How will the parish submit the tithe to the charity?

Each of the charities that receive a tithe will receive a letter explaining why we tithe *and also ask them to tithe part of the donation to a charity they value*, thus paying forward and increasing the scope of our donations.

REQUEST FOR FINANCIAL SUPPORT TO BUILD A RETIREMENT HOME FOR PRIESTS

The Catholic Archdiocese of Tamale, in Ghana, West Africa, desires to construct a Priests Home to serve as a decent residential abode for its retired Priests that would also be used as a center to provide psychological and other counselling services to the youth of Ghana who are frustrated due to the country's unemployment situation particularly in the Northern Regions. Many of these youth migrate south in search of non-existent jobs only to return disappointed and suffering from traumatic experiences resulting from the eroding and lowering of their self-respect and human dignities. Due to these experiences, they need psycho-social and rehabilitative care as well as other assistance to enable them to integrate back into their communities. The center will also be used to provide general public education on the negative consequences of migration practices to serve as a deterrent to would be adventurers. It is hoped that these steps will contribute immensely to the development of the region and ultimately contribute to a mutual peaceful co-existence amongst the residents of the Archdiocese.

The Archdiocese of Tamale has also founded a religious congregation for women who are specialized in clinical psychology and counselling. This religious congregation, along with priests trained in Counselling Psychology, will offer the counselling services for the target group.

So far, the Archdiocese through its own local initiative has been able to raise the sub-structure and columns for the ground floor. We still need an amount of \$250,000.00 to complete the project. Our appeal at your Parish therefore, is to help us raise some of this amount to further this priority Archdiocesan Project in the near future.

We are very pleased you have kindly accepted that an appeal may be made in your Parish to ask for your support in our efforts to build a home for the above outlined purpose. The Archbishop has asked me, Fr. Christopher Beyuo, to come and make our appeal.
