What is Ordinary Time?:

Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of **Ordinary Time**, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ.

Ordinary Time is a **time for growth and maturation**, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

There was a trip planned, and our mother gave Pier Giorgio the money for the trip. Often more than necessary, sometimes just that [which was needed]. Invariably, then, his great battle began. From the moment he put the money in his pocket, until he returned home, dead tired but cheerful and satisfied, he persisted in mentally organizing his expenses so that they left over money for his poor.

However, my mother never managed to get the receipts from him: there was always something wrong and the sums didn't add up. And there wasn't a trip that didn't find him absolutely penniless in the end: either

he had paid for someone's train ticket or a meal or a stay at a hotel. In short, his money belonged to everyone and the greatest proof came when he left for a trip to Germany with a decent sum, including occasional and budgeted alms, he returned home without even a lira: indeed, with only a lira. 
Happy Blessed Father's Day!

My dear brothers in Christ,
