What is Ordinary Time?

Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of **Ordinary Time**, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ. Ordinary Time is a **time for growth**

and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

Father Bernardo Ponzetto had the Maiolo family particularly at heart, whose head of the family, taken by renal tuberculosis in 1917, was still lying in bed in 1922, almost unable to sleep. He therefore let a daughter of the Maiolos' enter the Salesian nuns of Bagnolo and then continually went to the aid of his wards [minors] with money, gifts of all kinds, assistance on all occasions. During this time, in anonymous secrecy, Pier Giorgio remained the priest's most effective assistant, procuring belongings and money, helping in the procedures to be carried out for the hospitalization of the little girl. Reinstating Precious Blood

We recently received a question about whether our parish would reinstate the distribution of Precious Blood ("the cup") like some other parishes in the diocese have begun.

The short answer is "no." We have no plans to bring back Precious Blood while we are saying Mass in Seton School. There are multiple reasons for this.

First, Precious Blood is precious. If we are to recommence the praxis, people really need to be able to come forward to stations to protect from spillages. As you know this is not possible given the space constraints and setup for Masses at Seton.

Second, we would need more Extraordinary Ministers of Communion at every Mass to be able to do this and more ministers means we would need more altar and sanctuary space — both of which are overcrowded.

Third, purification of vessels would multiply and I'm unwilling to purify multiple chalices besides my own that I share with the deacon, for sanitary and time extension of Mass reasons. Hence, we would need a deacon committed to every Mass and we only have one deacon right now who has many responsibilities outside the liturgies.

We will re-evaluate reinstating the distribution of Precious Blood, when we move out of Seton School and into our new building in about 3 years. Until then we are doing a number of other things to enhance the sacred liturgies at Frassati. We've added Masses every day of the week except Tuesday and four litanies. We've just begun to have music for all Masses of the rank of Feast or Solemnity (This equates to about 25 more Masses with music and cantor each year). We're looking to replace older liturgical vessels (e.g., the ciboria, which hold the consecrated Hosts).
